Graded Readers: Graded readers are workbooks that contain selections from Koine Greek literature (Septuagint, New Testament, Apostolic Fathers). Readers give rare vocabulary and develop grammatical concepts to expand understanding past the basic level. If you take an intermediate Greek course, it may use one of these readers. The readers are listed in an order that progresses in difficulty (in my opinion).
